Dan Rayfield announces over 100 Endorsements in just 30 Days

Elected and Community Leaders across Oregon throw support behind Rayfield's AG campaign

Corvallis, OR – Today, Democrat Dan Rayfield announced 100 endorsements for his campaign for Oregon Attorney General after declaring his candidacy just last month. The endorsements represent a broad swath of federal, state, and local elected officials including:

Public safety and legal community leaders are also supporting Rayfield, including retired Corvallis Police Chief Nick Hurley, who said: "Dan understands what the Attorney General can do to help make Oregon safer and a record of leadership to make it happen."

Rayfield stressed that the endorsements he has earned so far are just the beginning of the campaign's outreach. "We are incredibly excited about reaching out to every corner of Oregon to talk about how the next Attorney General can be the People's Lawyer to help make Oregon safer, more equitable and just and more effective for all Oregonians."
